- Reported to ENSREG, 6 of March
- → The report from the Ad hoc group agreed by ENSREG on the 10 of April



The ENSREG 12 principles

(update of the ENSREG principles from 2008)

- (1) maintain and seek to continuously improve nuclear safety and its regulation, and add value to achieve a high level of safety (updated)
- (4) seek to enhance not reduce the power, roles, responsibilities or capability of the national nuclear regulatory body (2008)
- (5) not expand the role of the EC in regulatory decisions making or activities nor introduce other bodies (2008)
- (6) not divert resources away from national nuclear regulatory responsibilities or international nuclear safety co-operation (2008)
- (9) seek to improve the transparency of nuclear safety and its regulation (2008)



Four important areas

- Functional independence
- Transparency
- Ambitious safety goals/objectives
- Periodical topical peer review (6 years)
