

**Bullet points to Mr. Komarov's speech for the European Nuclear Safety
Conference (ENSREG)
June 28, 2017**

- **It is an honor to speak in front of you today – we deeply respect ENSREG and the work it is doing in the European Union and outside its borders to enhance nuclear safety.**
- **As a responsible vendor and supplier, Rosatom has always paid special attention to nuclear safety. Moreover, safety is one of our key values.**
- **Today we work in 47 countries, our portfolio includes 42 NPP units at different stages of construction. Such a significant amount of orders imposes an even greater responsibility. Right after the “Fukushima-Daichi” incident, we have implemented our own stress-test program to improve nuclear safety. We constantly follow all IAEA and WANO safety standards and recommendations.**
- **In August 2016, we have put on critical the 6th Unit of the Novovoronezh NPP. This is the first ever NPP that considers all «post-Fukushima» IAEA standards. This confirms our innovative approach and consideration of safety standards at the design stage.**
- **Rosatom is paying considerable attention not only to operational safety, but also to the creation of corresponding legal infrastructure and cooperation between regulatory bodies.**
- **Special emphasis is placed on the back-end processes of the nuclear fuel cycle, as we understand that the future of the atomic industry lies in that direction. Our mission is to relieve future generations of this burden and to solve concerns related to spent fuel and radioactive waste today. To do so, we are investing in technologies that will allow us to use regenerated uranium and plutonium as reactor fuel.**
- **We are convinced that atomic energy is the solution that will help implement the provisions of the Paris Agreement at the highest possible rate, contributing to the decarbonization of national economies and the sustainability of energy supplies.**
- **Massive energy projects that have significant environmental impact and affect sustainable consumer energy supplies both in Russia and the European Union must be subject to mutual discussion and study. We believe that only professional and transparent communication will lead to mutually beneficial solutions.**
- **I would like to express my gratitude to Conference President Mr Tiippana for the opportunity to address such a representative forum and emphasize ENSREG'S role in the enhancement of Nuclear Safety in European Union and outside its borders.**
